Trivia Answers

Hepatitis B and C can only be transmitted through blood-to-blood contact.

FALSE. This is true for hep C, but hep B can be transmitted through both blood-to-blood contact and sexual fluids. This is an important difference to be aware of.

What organ does hepatitis make sick?

LIVER. Fun fact, the word hepatitis actually means inflammation of the liver. Hepatitis is not specific to just viral hepatitis (e.g. hep B and C) it can be caused by alcohol or fatty diet, amongst many other things.

Hepatitis C can be cured but you can catch it again.

TRUE. While it is possible to cure hep C within 8 to 12 weeks, it does not make you immune. Therefore, risk activities such as sharing injecting equipment, puts you at risk of reinfection.

Which of the below activities can you get hepatitis B from?

UNPROTECTED SEX AND HOME TATTOOING.

Both of these activities can put you at risk of contracting hep B.

Sharing cutlery is a common myth, but the hep B virus cannot be transmitted through saliva, and it cannot be transmitted through breastmilk unless there is blood present (e.g. cracked nipples).

There is a vaccine available for all hepatitis viruses.

FALSE. There is a vaccine available for hep A and B, but not for hep C. In Australia, all babies are vaccinated for hep B at birth, and First Nations children receive hep A. Hep A is mostly offered by your doctor if you are travelling to some countries where it is more common. Hep A is transmitted via faecal to oral, not blood-to-blood or sexual fluids.

How often should I get checked if I have hepatitis B.

EVERY *6 -12 MONTHS.* It is important to receive regular 6 or 12 monthly check ups (as directed by your doctor) to monitor how your liver is coping with the hep B virus.

If I have hepatitis B, I must take medication.

FALSE. Not everyone will need medication, but this is why it is important to receive 6-12 monthly liver health checks. These checks allow your doctor to monitor the hep B virus, in case you do need medication to control damage to the liver.

If I get re-infected with hepatitis C, I can do treatment again.

TRUE. The new hep C medications can be taken again and again, but good harm reduction practices can remove the need to do treatment over and over. Remember to not share fits and avoid sharing items where blood-to-blood contact may occur (tattoos and hair clippers).

These guidelines are not suitable for everyone, especially if you have liver disease. Speak to a doctor about what is best for you.

TRUE. David Unaipon was an inventor and the first Aboriginal author published in Australia.

ALL CORRECT. There are a few other signs including low body temperate, pale/blue tinged skin or passing out. If you see anyone experience these signs, call for help immediately.

TRUE. Alcohol and tobacco are made of ingredients that can cause issues with the healthy development of the baby. Speak to a midwife or doctor for more information.

TRUE. Hep B and C are transmitted via blood-to-blood, therefore, sharing any type of injecting equipment (tourniquets, water, syringes etc.) which may have blood present, even if it isn't clearly visible, can put someone at risk of hepatitis B or C.
